### Assistant Conference Coordinator: needed

The conference will again be at Frederick Community College, in the new H building.

Last year's attendance was: 68

This year's attendance goal is over 100. Everyone was asked to attend and bring a friend or two, especially adjunct faculty members. Adjunct faculty members are valuable resources and would be welcome both as attendees and presenters. The conference is \$20 for MMATYC members, and \$30 for non-members. So, it makes sense for non-members attending the conference to use that cost differential as their annual dues for MMATYC.

This year, the conference is a one-day (Friday only) conference; however, there will be post-conference activities in downtown Frederick so that people can network.

For 2016, a conference site is needed. Our previous conferences have been either at Laurel Center (through Howard CC) or at Frederick CC. Other colleges should host the conference, preferably in another part of the state (although consideration should be given with regard to location convenience for the DelMATYC members who would like to attend, as well). This is a good local conference for mathematics faculty members. Members were asked to consider hosting the conference in 2016. Organizing and hosting is approximately an 8-month project.

The Assistant Conference Coordinator is needed for the 2015 conference. Ideally, that person's college would host the 2016 MMATYC Conference. The Assistant Conference Coordinator would be learning everything they would need to know regarding how to set up and run the conference. As previously stated, the process takes about eight months from start to finish.

The formation of several special committees were proposed, including the MMATYC Student Math League, the MMATYC Developmental Mathematics Committee, the MMATYC Innovative Teaching and Learning Committee, and the MMATYC Communication Committee.

Special committees are not standing committees. Special committees are more flexible and fluid than standing committees. Special committees may become standing committees after a number active years. So, these newly-formed committees (if established) will be considered as special committees for now.

MMATYC Student Math League: This committee would help to promote and further organize Maryland community colleges who currently participate in the annual competition, as well as to get the other colleges involved. Prizes are awarded to Maryland's winners in both categories. Each year, MMATYC submits the winning student and team representing Maryland for the national competition.

Motion moved, seconded, and approved via verbal vote to officially form the MMATYC Student Math League.

Susan Strickland is the AMATYC Student Math League Chair and will be an excellent resource for the committee.

The need for someone to chair the committee was next. The position would be a oneyear term.

A suggestion was made and withdrawn regarding the procedure for determining the chair. Those in attendance agreed to accept nominations and vote as was done for the other positions earlier.

Nominations for Chair of the MMATYC Student Math League (1): Math Lochman (Howard CC)

Matt Lochman accepted the nomination. A vote was taken. Matt was voted Chair unanimously.

MMATYC Developmental Mathematics Committee: The committee would help to unite the developmental mathematics educators in the state. Either the chair (or someone on the committee as designated by the chair) would be our DEAM representative.

Motion moved, seconded, and approved via verbal vote to officially form the MMATYC Developmental Mathematics Committee.

The need for someone to chair the committee was next. The position would be a oneyear term.

Nominations for Chair of the MMATYC Developmental Mathematics Committee (1): Kylene Cross (FCC)

Kylene Cross accepted the nomination. A vote was taken. Kylene was voted Chair unanimously.

MMATYC Innovative Teaching and Learning Committee: motion moved, seconded.

After a discussion on what this committee would be doing and an examination of the multiple committees that were already formed, a vote was taken, and the motion was rejected.

MMATYC Communication Committee: This committee would be concerned with all MMATYC communications issues including (but not limited to) the M.M.A.T.Y.C. Newsletter and MMATYC's online presence (e.g. the website, Facebook, Twitter, etc.). Good communication is vital to any organization's success. Having several people whose focus is on different aspects of communication on the committee ensures a cohesive communication network among MMATYC members and other interested parties.

Motion moved, seconded, and approved via verbal vote to officially form the MMATYC Communication Committee.

Theme for the 2015 MMATYC Conference

Suggestions were solicited for possible themes for the upcoming conference at Frederick CC on May 29<sup>th</sup>.

- 1. Electronic versus Face-to-Face Instruction (teaching styles and modalities)
- 2. Tried but True (classic teaching methods)

# **Future Conference Sites**

The conference has been at either Howard CC or Frederick CC. Other community colleges should be hosting the conference, too. Evan asked that anyone interested in hosting the conference talk with their Department Chairs and Deans. Given the fact that the enrollments are down and there are increasing budgetary restrictions on the colleges (e.g. for some, funding for travel has been discontinued), this conference is a good choice for professional development opportunities for both full-time and adjunct faculty members. The cost is minimal -- \$20 for MMATYC members and \$30 for non-members. Colleges indicating and interest in hosting the conference in the future include Hagerstown, CCBC, Cecil, and possibly Wor Wic. Please contact Evan as soon as possible if you are interested. It is suggested that someone from the host site of the 2016 conference be the Assistant Conference Coordinator this year.

#### **Future Conference Duration**

There is interest in having a 2-day conference. That way, people coming from further distances will be able to justify staying overnight.

### DelMATYC

The members of DelMATYC are very interested in attending our conferences. However, unless our conference is a 2-day event, it will need to be close to Delaware (e.g. Cecil or possibly the Eastern Shore). We have an agreement that DelMATYC members who present at the MMATYC conference will have their registration fee waived (this is reciprocated); we have a similar agreement with NCMATYC, which has been very successful.

#### **AMATYC**

A committee is currently rewriting Beyond Crossroads. The original Crossroads was written 20 years ago; 11 years ago the first revision, Beyond Crossroads, was written. This will be the next version.

Project ACCCESS is a wonderful mentoring and professional development opportunity for faculty members early in their community college teaching careers (first, second or third year of a full-time teaching position). Evan Evans (Cohort 4), Sarah Miller (Cohort 9), and Kylena Cross (Cohort 10) are all Project ACCCESS Fellows.

# Student Math League

Two-part competition will be conducted again this spring semester. Each school holds internal competitions and then forwards their top 5 students to be considered for representing Maryland. Teams also compete. Maryland awards cash prizes for the top individual and for the top team. In addition, those are submitted for consideration at AMATYC for the national awards (both individual and team).
